RECENT SPEAKER: MIKE ARCHER ON "THE AIR TANKER CRISIS"

Mike is a journalist and owns a book company. His special interest is writing about fighting fires. He gave the club an excellent

run-down on the crisis we are facing in not having enough fire-fighting aircraft available in our country today.

"Air Tankers" began in 1955 with the use of a Stearman biplane, followed by war surplus bombers using contract pilots. In more recent times, C-130 transports and planes built originally as subhunters have been used. In 2002, however, the Government grounded many of

these aircraft because of frequent crashes.

The air tanker fleet has shrunk from 45-50 aircraft to 10-15, or 25% of what it used to be. An important part of the problem is that many pilots have died while flying these missions, or they have pulled out of this field. This is because their families do not receive any death benefits.

Air Tankers are an extremely important part of fighting forest, range and brush fires. This capability is now severely limited in our country. There are efforts being made to solve the problem: there are several bills being considered in Congress. One is to help get the planes back into the air, and the others are to get the pilots the benefits they need. But, right now these bills are buried in sub-committee. You need to contact your Congressman and get him or her to support the following bills!

Aerial Firefighter Relief Act of 2005: H.R. 1232 in the House and S. 1143 in the

Senate.

Air Tanker Emergency Release Act of 2004: H.R. 4533 in the House.
